A unique color (Pantone 1955, actually called "Qatar maroon", that refers to the sun's effect on red and Qatar's purple dye industry back in the times of the Ottoman Empire).

A unique shape (an original 11:28 ratio).

And foremost a unique design with 9 white serrated points on the hoist side that symbolizes the victory of good over bad, life over death... light over shadow.



That is why our proposal will revolved mostly about the flag of the State of Qatar (including of course Qatar's National Day brand identity and symbol).

3 main colors: White, Qatar Maroon, and Gold (as its complementary color). Setting a great challenge in terms of light design but, as with all great challenges, resulting in a brilliant, unique and meaningful proposal.

A proposal that, **combined with the most advanced edge lighting technology**, will truly amaze each and everyone in our spectators with **a lighting spectacle that has not been seen ever before.**















Such a unique and symbolic celebration really deserves a truly unique and symbolic moment.

That's why we would like to recreate history the night of December 17th 2018, with a unique act of inauguration and "turning lights on moment", asking for the honor of having the presence of His Highness Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani in this unique act.
